#### SUNDAY REFLECTION

### 2Samuel 7:1-5, 8b-11, 16; Psalm 88; Romans 16:25-27; Luke 1:26-38

The theme of the readings for today is the fulfilment of the promises God made so long ago.

In our first reading from the second book of Samuel, we read of how King David lamented the fact that he was living in a fortified house while the Ark of the Covenant – which had been with the people since they left Egypt – was still housed in a tent. He resolved to build a permanent structure for the ark but the Lord sent word to him that he was to hold back from doing so. Instead, the Lord was to bless David and give him a house in the form of a line of descendants, and from this line would come one whose sovereignty would last forever. The Psalm celebrates the abiding care and faithful love of God who honours the promise he made to ensure the survival of David's house and line: 'I will sing for ever of your love, O Lord'.

In the second reading the author of the letter to the Romans was exhorting the people to greater faith. He called on them to strengthen their own faith and then to pass that faith on to others. The key message he was putting forward was the mystery of God which lay hidden for generations, but which had now been revealed in Jesus Christ, who was the wisdom of God.

The gospel describes the unexpected way in which the promise made to David was fulfilled through the birth of the 'Son of the Most High' from Mary, who was betrothed to a man from the house of David and, hence, legally herself of that house. This annunciation is tied in closely with that to Zechariah and straightaway the contrasts are clear: John will be born to aged parents, but Jesus to a virgin; John will be great before the Lord, but Jesus is Lord. Through Mary's consent, 'I am the handmaid of the Lord: let what you have said be done to me', God has come to live permanently in our human nature, building a house for himself in the womb of the Virgin Mary. The Ark for the Covenant, which David wished to build of wood, took flesh in Mary who became the living Ark which carried Jesus because she had faith in God and placed her trust in him to guide her life. We too are called to have greater faith and trust in God and to be arks to carry the Good News of salvation wherever we go.
