The Sadducees are only heard of this Sunday in the three years, although this Gospel story occurs in all three synoptic Gospels - the Lectionary avoids repetition. They were a faction in Jerusalem, who disagreed with the Pharisees on several points but like them were trying to trick Jesus into saying something they could use as an excuse to arrest him. The question they ask could make Jesus say something against Moses. They could have asked the Pharisees and got the same answer. These disputes are not relevant to us today, but they give Jesus an opportunity to give some important teaching about the Resurrection of the Dead. God is the God not of the dead, but of the living. The first reading, from 2 Maccabees, is a horror story and reading the whole passage is even worse - the editors of the Lectionary have spared us the full ghastliness and the details of the martyrdom of all seven brothers. The point of reading it is that it is one of the clearest passages in the OT about the resurrection, which only became something talked about in late Judaism - this explains why the Sadducees did not accept it. A theme more appropriate to next Sunday, the remembrance of the sacrifice of those who died in war, thus has a reflection in the Scriptures. 2R give support too: *the Lord is faithful, and he will give you strength and guard you from the evil one. (The Liturgy Planner)*

Jezus bardzo dużo uwagi w swoim nauczaniu poświęcał zmartwychwstaniu ciał. Przekonywał, że ta prawda nie jest niczym nowym. Wskazywał, że ma ona swoje źródła jeszcze w Starym Testamencie. Powoływał się na Mojżesza, tak bardzo cenionego przez naród Izraela. Chrystus podkreślał, że śmierć nie jest ostatecznym końcem człowieka, że naszym powołaniem jest życie w Bogu tu na ziemi i kiedyś w niebie. Saduceusze wyśmiewali jednak tę prawdę. Argumentowali swoje racje przejawskrawionym przykładem, przekładając ziemskie relacje na rzeczywistość nieba. Jezus wyprowadzał ich z błędu. Przekonywał, że wieczność nie będzie doskonalszą wersją życia na ziemi. Jaka więc będzie? Nie wiemy. To ciągle jest tajemnicą. Być może ta nasza niewiedza skłania nas ku wątpieniu w życie po śmierci, ale nie powinniśmy się poddawać takiej pokusie. Skoro Jezus potwierdził tę prawdę, to nie mamy podstaw, by w nią wątpić.
