Pentecost Vigil Mass

The great Solemnity of Pentecost falls this year on Sunday 8th June. This is the birthday of the Church! It's the day when the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles, filling them with His powerful gifts. They immediately went out to the whole world, spreading everywhere the good news about Jesus Christ!

Quite rightly, Pentecost is recognised to be the 3rd most important liturgical celebration in the whole year (after Easter and Christmas).

Now, Easter has it's amazing Vigil Mass. Christmas has midnight Mass. What does Pentecost have? Well, it's not very well known by the majority of Catholics, but there is a special Mass for the Vigil of Pentecost. In it we gather together with Mary and the Apostles, as it were in the Upper Room, waiting expectantly for the promised One, the Spirit of Life! An extended liturgy of the word – a little like in the Easter Vigil – consisting of 4 readings from the Old Testament, helps us to reflect on the Gift of the Holy Spirit and His place in our lives.

Join us in Fraserburgh for this special Pentecost Vigil – Saturday 7th June, starting at 9pm.
